Dear Brothers and Sisters,



We are entering summer, as students begin a lengthy break from school and many people will enjoy the warm weather with vacations and outdoor activities. We begin the month of June with the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, and we move into the third year of the National Eucharistic Revival with the year of mission. We celebrate the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist and the Eucharist as the Source and Summit of Christian Life in the Catholic Church. Most of us celebrate and experience the Eucharist in our parish.

The song, Summertime, And the livin' is easy will not apply here this summer. There will be much to do as we work out a plan for our three parishes to work together and share more than a few things to help each parish respond to the call of Jesus' mission, and as we form ourselves into missionary disciples. My concern is that many people only hear that we remain our individual parish and do not hear the collaborating or working together part. The best way I can think to explain our formation by Bishop Bonnar as a Col-

laborative Unit of parishes is the 1958 film *The Defiant Ones* with Tony Curtis and Sidney Poitier. Curtis and Poitier are members of a chain gang and are being transported through the South when their truck crashes and they have a chance to escape. The issue is that the two men are shackled together, and need to work together even though they are very different. We can imagine that Paul Newman is the third tired to Curtis and Poitier. I am not suggesting our three parishes are convicts on a chain gang, but the only way we can remain individual parishes is that we are shackled together by our collaborative grouping.

During this early part of June, we need to align our Mass schedule, work on communication between the parishes and myself, move the Good Shepherd parish office from St. Columba to a space at St. Angela Merici, and begin the search to hire a few shared Staff positions based on the ministries that we will need to share. There will be a lot more to work on, and it will continue on in July and August. I can hear the hound dogs barking, time to run. We run knowing Jesus is with us.

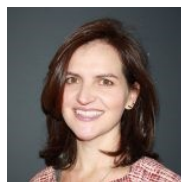
