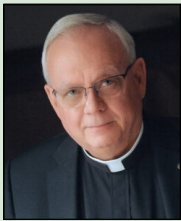

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany, the Lord is being shown and revealed. The Psalmist today invites us; “Lord, every nation on earth will adore you”. The Feast today reminds us that the Lord Jesus was born to save us, reveal the Father’s love and to call us to be his disciples, sharing in the work of the Gospel. We normally think of the three wise men bringing gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Each of these gifts can suggest faithful ways of discipleship.
