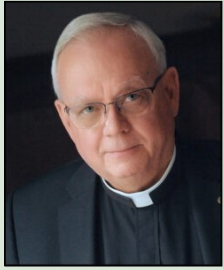

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



I was on retreat this past week at St. Mary Seminary in Cleveland. All our families were in my prayers! The 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our Church last week was truly beautiful, joyful and grace filled! A special thank you to our anniversary committee and all who participated. Let's pray for success and graced filled second 100 years!

Today the Scriptures invite us to realize our special and gifted relationship to the Father through Jesus.

Our special relationship began in creation and was molded by the Lord as his chosen people sojourned in the desert. In the book of Exodus, we hear the conversation between the Lord and Moses: "You have seen for yourselves how I treated the Egyptians and how I bore you up on eagle wings and brought you here to myself. Therefore, if you harken to my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my special possession, dearer to me than all other people, though all the earth is mine. You shall be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation."

Although we know the long history of the Lord calling his people to himself, they often failed and abandoned him. In the fullness of time, God sent his son to call us to himself.

Returning today to our journey through Matthew's Gospel (Ordinary Time), we see Jesus calling the twelve apostles and sending them out to share his mission. That same call to share in his mission also belongs to us.
